# ON THE HUNT FOR SAFETY

LREC's right-of-way (clearing between power lines) can provide attractive hunting grounds and easy passage, but it also contains our power lines, fiber lines, substations, and workers, day and night.

- Before you begin a hunt, note the location of power and fiber lines and other equipment.

  Dense trees can make them hard to see.
- Never shoot at electrical equipment, power or fiber lines.
- Obey all signs or postings that advise electrical safety.
- Before you shoot, be sure of your target and what's beyond it. Never shoot birds on lines.
- A single shot can cause damage to our system, which can result in internet interruptions. Damage to co-op property can lead to expensive repair costs or legal action against the individual who fired the shot.

Report damage of electrical or fiber equipment to LREC immediately by calling 918-772-2526.

### **4 KEY FACTORS**

### **IMPACTING YOUR ENERGY BILL**

You pay for the electricity you consume each month, but there are additional factors that impact your energy bill.



### **FUEL COSTS**

Before electricity can be delivered to your home, it must first be generated at a power plant or from a renewable source. The cost of fuels used to generate electricity fluctuates, which is why you see a Power Cost Adjustment (PCA) on your monthly bill. This monthly charge covers cost fluctuations without the need for frequent rate adjustments.

### **SERVICE COSTS**

Your bill includes service availability, which recovers part of the co-op's ongoing investments in poles, wire, meters, system maintenance, and additional costs of doing business necessary to provide electric service to our members in rural Oklahoma.

### **WEATHER** \

When temperatures soar or dip, your cooling or heating equipment must run longer and at maximum capacity, which can greatly increase your energy use.

### **ENERGY CONSUMPTION**

This is the amount of electricity you use each month to power your home's cooling/heating system, appliances, lighting, electronics, and more. The amount of electricity you consume is measured in kilowatt-hours, or kWh. You have control over how much energy you use, which can ultimately help manage your monthly costs.
