Small Change that Changes Lives

2014 was a great year for LREC's Operation Round Up program with \$82,237 rewarded in grants. Every penny of each grant went to nonprofit organizations, local individuals and families, right here in LREC's service area.

Operation Round Up was introduced at LREC in 2007 and is quickly becoming a source of funds for struggling nonprofit programs and families. Members have to agree to have their electric bill "rounded up" each month to the nearest dollar – an average of \$6 per year to be donated to the charitable Operation Round Up program. Today, over 15,400 members participate in Operation Round Up – that is


